Hi! I am Maria Patterson, Uganda team member from St. Mary by the Sea. With so much terrible dis-connect these days, it is good to reflect upon St. Aloysius girls' school in Uganda and all the unadulterated good! One of my readings today made me think of Sister Immaculate. It was by Charity Kiregyera of Kampala. She had inadvertently set a fire while working on a garden plot. In her panic she suddenly remembered to call upon the lord. She prayed: "Lord help me; you always help me when I ask. Please don't let this fire cross the boundaries." She continued that "the fire eventually died down and I lifted my hands and thanked God. Anxiety is a natural response to misfortune and danger. When we hold on to our anxiety and allow it to overwhelm us, fear may keep us from being able to think calmly or trust God. ... We can cast our fears on the Lord. In times of anxiety we can trust the God who cares for us will move to help us solve our problems."

Doesn't that remind you of our own Sister Immaculate? Such a woman of great faith!
