A message from the St Aloysius team on accomplishments of last year and plans for this year...

Our Steering Committee feels so proud and thrilled that we have been able to accomplish so much for the St Aloysius students in Uganda!

<u>During this past year alone, over 200 donors have contributed \$38,454 to the support of St.</u>

Aloysius!

On the back of this newsletter you will see a list of improvements we have helped to accomplish over the past four years. Our most important goal has been to provide scholarships. We have no big fundraising activities planned for this year except for continued scholarship support.

Why is scholarship support so important? Over half of the 350 students receive help from us! Approximately 20 girls are on full scholarships and about 150 receive partial help. Sr Immaculate says that the school year is divided into 3 terms. Each term costs students \$150. Most partial scholarships equal \$50 per term and parents must come up with \$100.

You will meet in this newsletter two very promising girls who are depending upon our continued generosity and support.

Meet Lydia! Lydia dropped out after completing her S4 level. She scored highly but her family could not afford her tuition fees. She cried in my office today over her situation. She was abandoned by her dad who now has another family and her mother is helpless. She has lived some kind of stressful life! Even before now she could fail to bring even school

supplies, and yet she is <u>so</u> bright and capable. She scored very high on her tests! We have had to help her out as if she has been orphaned.

I am very glad we can continue working together with your help to give her an education. I don't want to send her home as she has worked so hard.

Great news . . . our students passed their exams with very good scores. We are now ranked #4 in our Kalunga District and #98 in the whole country out of over 3,000 schools! We are giving a good education to our girls which we could not do without your tremendous support!! Thank you!!

- 7. Cafeteria.

- 9. More water storage containers and added water catchment system.
- 10. Two water pumps.
- 11. InStove cooker for the sisters' house.
- 12. Main dorm roof repair.
- 13. Six large suitcases of supplies for students and teachers.
- 14. Grass roof hut study shelter.
- 15. Benches and tables for the cafeteria.
- 16. Main hall roof replacement (in process).
- 17. Provided funds to buy food during two times of drought in the past five years.
- 18. Hepatitis B shot series to all students and teachers who needed them.
