Dear Friends! Oh my goodness! What a relief!!! I am sooo happy about such wonderful news! God bless your hearts dear friends! I have just heard that you have wired us \$2840 and also another wire



for \$750. God bless you as there is very little money coming from our villager parents and I have been so worried. You are wonderful. Some girls were so stressed too and afraid they might be sent home. Even the fees for the National test examination has become too expensive and your donations will help us pay for those. I don't know how to thank you enough for your generosity.

We are now so glad to have all 10th and 12th grade girls back. We had to call and send messages to some villages to get a few back because the parents had failed to get any money for tuition so the girls did not return. We do our best to keep everyone in school with your help. Thank you for saving us through this Covid-19 situation. We have now called back our S.5 (11th grade) girls to at least have lessons for a month before Christmas break. They are reporting back on 8th November. We hope and pray that we shall be fine because we have enough space for them. That class only has a total of 22 girls returning since many of this class passed their Normal High School Certificate and chose not to continue with the last two years of advanced classes.

We are trying hard to keep everyone healthy with temperature testing and hand washing. Everyone has at least one mask and we all must have social distancing which seems to be successful.
