In this June newsletter you will see that the St. Aloysius students have been very busy with debate competitions and planning future projects to challenge them in this 2nd term. We have also received letters from some of our scholarship students to share with you in this newsletter and the next.

Our financial report from the team is that we are still on target to meet this year's goal, thanks to so many of you who help us with scholarship donations. Our goal is \$60,000 for this 2023 year. As of the end of May, we have sent just under \$35,000.

My mother tried to seek help for us. Through God's mercy and good grades we got sponsors through your program at St. Aloysius. Without your help I would be knitting scarves to sell and

Checks are deposited monthly into the account for St. Aloysius Girls School, then wired to Uganda. \$50 dollars sent each month can keep a girl in school and help with teachers' salary! It costs \$500 a year for tuition, room, board and uniform. The extra \$100 is to cover increased cost of teacher salaries.
