We hope everyone was able to read the above article as it contains information that Sister Immaculate had been worried about during the prolonged lockdowns in Uganda. The main points are:

- ** Up to one-third of all students may not return to school! One non-profit exec said, "We may have lost a generation." Remember, high school education in Uganda is NOT compulsory and tuition is charged in all schools beyond 6th grade. Many parents will struggle to pay tuition in this weak economy.
- ** Many teachers will not return to the profession and have moved to other jobs because they were not paid during lockdown (remote learning in Uganda was basically non-existent).
- ** Over 3500 grade schools and over 800 high schools will likely close permanently, according to the government.

Because of your support, St. Aloysius is one of the schools that has reopened on time! Thank you! During lockdown, teachers were paid some of their salary and the buildings at St. Aloysius were improved upon. Thank you!

St. Aloysius is still able to offer scholarships to students in need. Thank you!

The girls are happy to be back to school after a long period of lock down. The teachers too are happy to meet their learners after that long forced holiday.

These activities are intended to prepare our girls and teachers for their academic task as they begin classes next week. At the same time we are still receiving children back as most parents are still struggling to look for the requirements of their children to come back to school. Many have returned and currently the enrollment is 477!
