We are not allowing visitors onto our compound and the Covid situation here is scaring us! We hear people are dying. And soon they will be starving too!

Other news here is that these days it is too sunny and the rainy season has stopped too soon. Some of our crops are just dying in the fields, especially our main crop, the maize. It is going to be tough for most of us in Uganda because we are financially constrained, stressed with Covid and now food is going to be even more scarce and expensive.

We must save all the money you send now to last for food and staff salaries. If we don't pay our workers, they will starve. So I will say again, with thankful tears, you have saved us!

May our God of all bless you forever . . . .

#### A message from the Uganda Team . . . .

Sometime ago at one of our team meetings, the question came up about the monthly budget for St. Aloysius. Specifically, folks wanted to know about staff salaries. In answer to these questions, Sr. Immaculate sent the following information:

Our total monthly budget is about \$6,883. This includes salaries for cooks, office aides, farm workers, the driver, guards, and teachers. Most of the pay is for our teachers who are all very well qualified with college certifications. An average teacher makes about \$115 per month. It is little money and some of the teachers work part time in other schools and at other jobs too. In normal times, men raising families often find part time work to get extra cash.

Some schools pay a little higher than we are able to pay, but during Covid our teachers felt that St. Aloysius has been a very reliable school; more so than any other school around. We have also been able to share our food! Plus, with your help, the staff have been getting their full salaries although sometimes it has been late. We have heard that those who teach at some big fancy private schools were getting only half their salary. For these reasons we have been able to keep a stable staff. I must continuously thank you, our friends, for your contributions during these tough time!

As an aside, when Catherine, Dia and Sophia visited St. Aloysius two years ago, we asked Immaculate why she didn't have more female teachers. She answered that most teachers in Uganda are men and most college educated people in Uganda are men. This is exactly why, dear friends, we are supporting St. Aloysius and what the school does so well . . . . educate women for the sake of Uganda's future and growth as a nation!
