In Sister Immaculate's letter you read how excited she is for her girls to come back to school. She has told us many times that the longer her girls are gone, the more she worries about them.

Along with the teachers, she tries to keep in contact with them and encourages them to keep studying with the text books they took with them when they left last March. Once the older school girls go back to their villages, it is common for them to feel pressure to get married. So let us hope that all these S4 and S6 girls will come back to school to take their final tests and National Exams.

"Summer" vacation in Uganda usually begins the first week of December following national exams and goes until the end of January. For this upcoming year, the government says that it will be adjusting the school calendar and Sister is waiting to see just what that means.

(That would be US grades 10 and 12.) These, approximately <u>90 girls</u>, will come back first because they have important national tests to take very

soon. Other students will report back as the government allows.

We will be very busy continuing to prepare for the 15th! This week we are going to work on the van tires. We are also going to put a carriage on top of the van where we can put student luggage. Some students come from remote and far districts like Hoima and Kassanda so we pick them up because transport means are difficult and not so Covid safe on the buses these days.

I hope you enjoy the pictures of our continuing preparations in this newsletter. Thank you again for your continued support! Please keep us in your prayers as we pray daily that God will take good care of you and your country.

On the 15th of each month, checks will be deposited into the account for Sr Immaculate, then wired to Uganda. She will use the money to buy food for the girls, pay teachers and continue building projects. Forty dollars sent each month can keep a girl in school ! It costs \$450 a year for tuition, room, board and uniform.
